1 THE SITE SHINED IN ITS FIRST SEASON

Feb. 18 is when the first load of fertilizer was put into the new dry shed with 3,600-ton capacity. The old shed had 600-ton capacity.

2 QUITE THE PAIR

Along with the Walnut, Illinois, location, this facility serves a 70-mile radius from north to south.



3 IT'S AUTOMATIC, SYSTEMATIC ... GREASE LIGHTNING

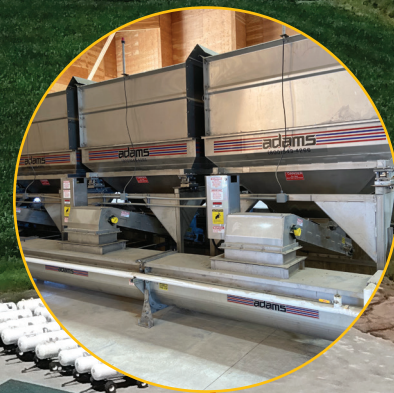
The Adams Decline-N-Weight blender is paired with LEC's PLC Control System, so the team can control it from an iPad—anywhere.

4 SPRINGTIME WORKLOAD

This site is also used for treating soybean seed for its division, totaling 75,000 bags of beans every year.

5 LESS RELIANT ON STRESSED TRUCK SUPPLY

The increased capacity has helped with having product on hand and relieving some of the pressure of being dependent on just-in-time delivery and limited trucking resources.



BUILT FOR PEAK IN-SEASON DEMAND

The anhydrous loading platforms feature swing-away arms to ease loading. The setup allows for filling 8 singles and a double simultaneously.

EASY TO ADD BIOLOGICALS

With an Adams dry fertilizer impregnation system, the crew uses products such as Titan XC to maximize the customers' return on dry fertilizer.

DECLINE-N-WEIGHT

Marketed as the "smartest" declining weight blend system, this site's multihopper setup was also equipped with the LEC control panel.

THE NEED FOR SPEED—FOR RECEIVING, TOO

The setup can unload a semi in 8 minutes. The tripper is remote-controlled, and Adams provided the galvanized stainless tower stand and staircase.

LOAD 'EM UP, AND MOVE THEM OUT

The integrated Adams Blender Load-Out Conveyors come standard with a stainless steel assembly and can be matched for efficient capacities.
