FOSTER POULTRY FARMS – *EX PARTE* PETITION FOR EMERGENCY SERVICE ORDER

EX PARTE PETITION FOR EMERGENCY SERVICE ORDER

Foster Poultry Farms ("Foster Farms"), with headquarters in Livingston, California, hereby requests the Surface Transportation Board ("Board" or "STB") to issue by June 17, 2022, on an *ex parte* basis, an emergency service order pursuant to 49 C.F.R. §1117.1 and the authority granted to the Board by 49 U.S.C. §11123(b)(1) to "act on application¹ without regard to subchapter II of chapter 5 of title 5." As set forth in greater detail below, continuing service failures by the Union Pacific Railroad Company ("UP") over the past five months have clearly established that UP, utilizing its current operating practices, cannot transport the rail "traffic offered to it [by Foster Farms] in a manner that properly serves the public," meaning (1) Foster

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While §11123(b)(1) refers to an "application" the Board has more recently referred to "petitions" for emergency service orders pursuant to §11123(b)(1) and so that term is used here. See EP 762, Revisions to Regulations for Expedited Relief in Service Emergencies (served April 22, 2022) at 3 ("The Board may act on its own initiative or pursuant to a petition, and emergency service may be ordered summarily (i.e., without regard to the Administrative Procedure Act)" Id. § 11123(b)(1)").

Farms, (2) the growers of the millions of animals to whom Foster Farms supplies feed made from corn delivered by UP in unit trains, and (3) the public at large that depends on the affected livestock for food.

As explained below, the emergency service order requested by this *Ex Parte* Petition is necessary to counter a substantial, measurable deterioration of rail service to Foster Farms' facilities located in Traver and Turlock, California by UP. These service failures, which began in February 2022, have resulted in numerous instances where Foster Farms has suspended its production and distribution of feed for tens of thousands of dairy cattle and tens of millions of chickens and turkeys which consume corn meal supplied by Foster Farms. It has also resulted in Foster Farms incurring considerable costs in an increasingly desperate and futile attempt to try to find alternative means and transportation modes to obtain and ship the huge quantities corn its facilities must have each week that UP delivered in the past with reasonable regularity but has demonstrated, without any doubt, that it can no longer do so for the indefinite future under its current operating plans and priorities.

Consequently, ample evidence exists for the Board to immediately issue an emergency order, pursuant to §11123(b)(1), §11123(a)(1) and (4)(A), directing UP, for a period of at least thirty (30) days, to direct the handling, routing and movement of Foster Farms' units trains over UP's system, and to give preference and priority to the movement of unit trains of corn tendered to UP by or on behalf of Foster Farms from origins in the Midwestern United States to Foster Farms' facilities in Traver and Turlock, California. This drastic action is necessary on an emergency basis to alleviate the severe harm to poultry, dairy and feed yard livestock, the harm to the livelihoods of the ranchers and growers who own them, and the extensive harm to Foster Farms' business that is being caused by UP's persistent service failures. In further support of

this *Ex Parte* Petition Foster Farms provides the facts and argument below. The factual assertions made in this filing are verified by Mr. Phil Greene, Vice President of Foster Farms (see attached Verification).

I. STATEMENT OF RELEVANT FACTS

A. Description of Foster Farms and its Facilities that are the Subject of this *Ex Parte* Petition

Foster Farms is the largest chicken grower and processor in the Western United States with over 12,000 employees. It processes for food consumption approximately 1,000,000 chickens and 12,000 turkeys in California every day. The Foster Farms' facilities at issue in this Petition are located in Traver and Turlock, California. Both are located on lines of railroad owned and operated by UP, as shown on the Map attached as Exhibit A to this *Ex Parte* Petition (approximate locations shown). Corn is the only commodity at issue in this emergency service order request. In normal times, it is delivered to Foster Farms' facilities by UP in 100-car unit trains of hopper cars, where it is processed into corn meal for feed. In addition to requiring corn to feed its own chickens and turkeys, Foster Farms is the supplier of corn to several nearby poultry producers.

California is the largest dairy state in the United States, and the corn Foster Farms purchases and ships on UP is also processed into corn flakes for around 500 cattle feed facilities located primarily in central California's San Joaquin Valley. The industry in California consists of about 3.7 million dairy and 1.5 million beef cattle, most of which depend upon corn as a critical feed ingredient.

Foster Farms does not own the four unit trains used by UP to fulfill Foster Farms' volume requirements at Traver and Turlock. Rather, beginning in December 2020 Foster Farms has leased the four trains from UP pursuant to its Grain Shuttle Program set forth in UP Tariff 4051. While

the unit trains are owned by UP, they are dedicated to Foster Farms' service. Each unit train holds approximately 12,000 tons of corn (120 tons per hopper car). The corn is typically originated at loading sites in the Nation's corn belt from Nebraska to Minnesota. The shipments have been governed by the rates and service terms set out in UP's tariffs and circulars and terms in ancillary agreements between UP governing Foster Farms' use of the trains and rebates that are not relevant to the issues in this Petition.³

The chickens, turkeys, and dairy cattle are fed from the Traver and Turlock facilities, plus its nearby mill at Delhi, California where Foster Farms is completing a project at significant cost to increase its inventory and receiving capacity in California. These facilities consume a minimum about a million bushels of corn each week combined and have done so for more than 40 years. The immense quantities of corn required at the Traver and Turlock facilities cannot feasibly be delivered by truck, either economically or operationally, and the facilities are captive to UP for rail service. This minimum (and inflexible) weekly consumption level mandates the delivery of a *minimum* of nine loaded unit trains per month (2.25 trains per week) divided between the two facilities, in addition to reasonable cushion of feed corn onsite to buffer typical rail service inconsistencies. Moreover, these train deliveries must be relatively ratable to maintain somewhat consistent quantities of feed at each facility over a given month.

Like many agricultural shippers Foster Farms' transportation service from UP is provided primarily pursuant to common carrier tariffs, which are supplemented by ancillary private agreements addressing non transportation issues. Such transportation is not considered contract transportation subject to 49 U.S.C. §10709, but this is issue not relevant for purposes of the Board's jurisdiction to entertain this *Ex Parte* Petition. *See* Docket No. EP No. 628, *Expedited Relief for Service Inadequacies* (served December 21, 1998) at 10 ("... where no service is being provided, we do not believe the mere existence of a contract precludes us from providing for temporary service, upon a proper showing"), *citing Joint Petition for Service Order*, STB Service Order No. 1518 (October 31, 1997), *et al.*

Receipt of an average of 2.25 trains, and as many as four trains per week at the Traver, Turlock, and soon to be opened (later this month) Delhi facilities is therefore critical to the well-being and survival of the livestock. The failure to feed chickens and turkeys adequate amounts of food creates an environment where they not only rapidly physically deteriorate from malnutrition, they also have the propensity to kill each other if they have been cut off from a food source. As for dairy cattle, the lack of food at a minimum adversely affects their ability to produce milk and to breed that cannot be resolved until the next calving cycle, and the extended lack of food can obviously eventually lead to death.

Over the past two and a half months Foster Farms has engaged in an intense, almost daily three-way dialogue with UP and the Deputy Director of the STB's Office of Public Assistance, Governmental Affairs and Compliance ("OPAGAC") to cajole and plead with UP to make unit train deliveries of corn to the Traver and Turlock facilities. Foster Farms has also engaged in many efforts to find alternative sources of corn delivered by different modes to stave off the starvation of the livestock and to supply its customers. It has spent over \$1,500,000 securing corn from trucking companies and purchasing unit trains of corn destined to other locations which are either delivered by UP or delivered by BNSF Railway ("BNSF") to locations on its tracks and the corn is transloaded and trucked to Foster Farms' facilities. Foster Farms even approached BNSF to obtain a commitment to provide alternative service to the Turlock and Travers facilities via BNSF's interchanges with UP at Fresno and Stockton, California. However, BNSF declined to make such a commitment, citing operational and other hurdles that BNSF considered to be

insurmountable.

This *Ex Parte* Petition is being filed at this time because, despite all of the efforts made by Foster Farms, the OPAGAC's Deputy Director, and even UP, UP's current operating plans and priorities simply cannot provide the service required at the Traver and Turlock facilities, and Foster Farms has run out of options for substituting the corn that should be delivered by UP by railroad with corn delivered by trucks. The point has been reached when millions of chickens will be killed and other livestock will suffer because of UP's service failures. The Board must direct UP to immediately change its current operations and priorities to place more emphasis on fulfilling its commitments and public duty as a common carrier to provide service to the Turlock and Traver facilities.

II. ARGUMENT

A. The Board Has Authority to Grant this Request

Section 11123 gives the Board broad authority to take immediate action in times when railroad service failures require immediate action to serve the public. Under this section, the Board may act on a petition or it may act on its own initiative, and under §11123(b)(1) the Board's powers are "extensive" and it can act quickly on an *ex parte* basis without a drawn-out administrative proceeding. The Board may take such action under §11123(b)(1) when it determines, in response to petition, "that a rail carrier providing transportation subject to the jurisdiction of the Board under

this part cannot transport the traffic offered to it in a manner that properly serves the public." Upon making such a determination, the Board has an extensive array of actions it can take to try to alleviate the harm over an initial 30-day period, including in pertinent part, "direct[ing] the handling routing and movement of the traffic of a rail carrier . . .,"8 and "giv[ing] directions . . . for priority or preference in transportation."9

B. Foster Farms Has Established Sufficient Facts for the Request to Be Granted

This *Ex Parte* Petition clearly establishes that UP's current allocation of crews and locomotives, and its decisions concerning what traffic moves on its system and when, prevents UP from transporting Foster Farms' unit trains in a manner than properly serves Foster Farms. Perhaps more significantly, because the commodity UP delivers to Foster Farms is corn that is exclusively used to feed hundreds of thousands of cattle and millions of chickens which are raised for the purpose of providing food supplies, the failure of UP to properly serve Foster Farm's facilities translates into a much greater failure to properly serve the public as a whole.

III. REQUEST FOR RELIEF

Based on the facts and reasons set forth above, Foster Farms asks the Board to grant this *Ex Parte* Petition and issue an emergency service order on or before June 17, 2022 directing UP to take the following actions concerning the transportation of Foster Farms' unit trains of corn to its Traver and Turlock facilities for at least 30 days from the date of the order:

- A. Prioritize the assignment of crews to Foster Farms' unit trains at loading origins.
- B. Prioritize the transportation of Foster Farms' unit trains on UP's system with the goal of minimizing the extent to which the crews on such trains

"time out" under the Hours of Service rules, thereby enabling the train to complete its movement from origin to destination without stopping, the crew departing, and then waiting for a new crew.

- C. Assign and retain sufficient locomotives to Foster Farms' trains at loading origins to ensure that once a Foster Farms' train is loaded there is sufficient locomotive power for the unit train to immediately begin its trip to Foster Farms' Traver and Turlock facilities.
- D. Direct UP to provide the Board with daily status reports over the 30-day period regarding the delivery of Foster Farms' trains, such reporting to include the number of trains and cars billed to Foster Farms' Traver and Turlock facilities, and actual performance versus trip plan data for these shipments.¹⁰

Finally, if UP should fail or refuse to comply with the Board's directives in an Emergency Service Order issued in response to this *Ex Parte* Petition, the Board should impose the maximum monetary civil penalties permitted under 49 C.F.R. §1022, and any penalty should be assessed on a per car basis, such that UP's failure to comply with the Board's directive as to a 100-car unit train shall equal the maximum penalty permitted under the Board's rules times 100.






